Ezekiel 18:25-28: This reading is about conversion, about people changing their ways, with a strong indictment of sinners. Ezekiel is a forthright prophet; for better or worse, he didn't sugar-coat the words of the Lord when he prophesied to the people of Israel. The reading ends on a more hopeful note...the Lord is as infinitely merciful as just.

Philippians 2:1-11: Paul gives advice to the community at Philippi, with instructions about living in community and sharing together in the life of Christ. By God's grace the Church manifests the body of Christ when it assembles, so the efforts and sacrifices that any members of the community make for the building up of the Church are tied to the Paschal Mystery of the suffering of Jesus. This is part of the gift of God's unimaginable generosity.

Matthew 21:28-32: Jesus applies the parable to the world of the hearers. He isn't criticizing the tax collectors and prostitutes here. He simply notes that they believed John the Baptist and so they will reach the kingdom before the priests and elders who didn't believe the Baptist.

Community is a Gift and a Task

Marianist Sister Nicole Trehan recently wrote an article for the Global Sisters Report, entitled Interculturality is a Gift and a Task (read the full piece here: <https://www.globalsistersreport.org/columns/interculturality-gift-and-task>).

While the article speaks to the intercultural part of her work, there are many themes that resonate with our small, local building part of Marianist life, too:

“A popular saying within the Marianist Family is, “Community is a gift and a task.” For Marianists, whose charism and spirituality are influenced by the Benedictine Rule, community is primary in our way of life. Community is a gift for each of us in the family — the Marianist Lay Communities, the secular institute Alliance Mariale, Marianist sisters (Daughters of Mary Immaculate), and the Marianist brothers and priests (the Society of Mary).

Community is also our gift to the church and the world. We seek to model healthy, nonhierarchical, egalitarian, interdependent relationships within and among our branches. This is a gift, I believe, that the church and world are in dire need of today.

Community also takes work. We recognize that the type of community to which we aspire doesn't simply happen. It takes intentionality, honesty, humility, flexibility, communication, accountability and commitment. Essentially, it requires the action of the Spirit and an openness of heart.”
