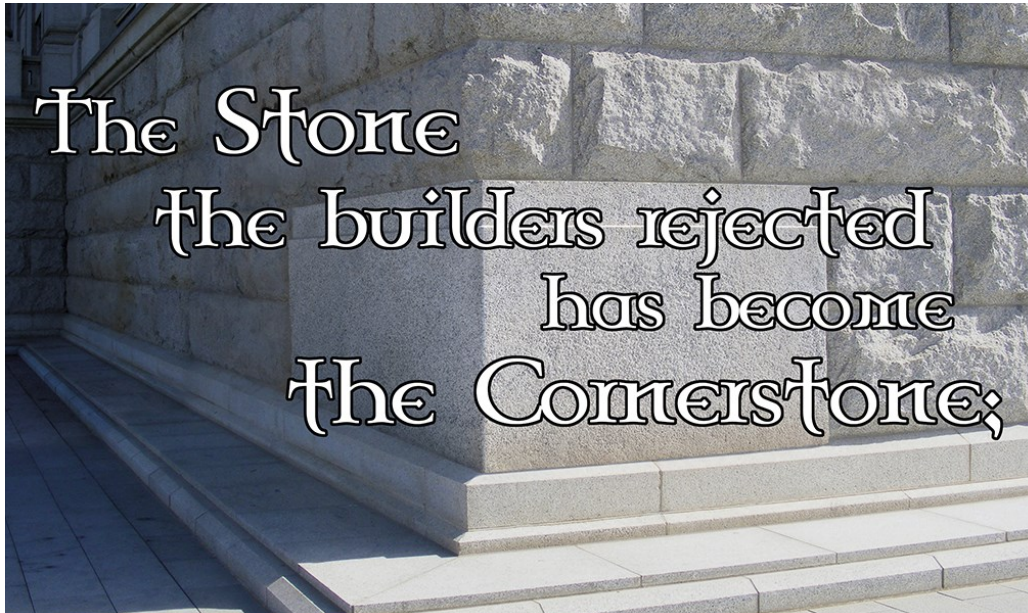

Isaiah 5:1-7: The reading is about Israel’s infidelity, and Isaiah explains their present misery by demonstrating that they have brought it on themselves. But even more important, the purpose of the ballad is to call Israel to repentance, a return to their God. As they weep and wail over their dispersion and exile, they are reminded that a God of love made them what they are and can restore them to what they should be.

Philippians 4:6-9: The list of good things toward which our thoughts ought to be directed is not specifically religious and certainly not uniquely Christian. All people of goodwill embrace what is true, honest, pure, gracious, and so forth. What makes the difference for us is that these good things are sought not to obtain faith; they are sought because we have faith.

Matthew 21:33-43: This story has more than one application. Certainly it is a reminder that we must be slow to take our status as “members of the elect” for granted. Perhaps even more important is the admonition to be on the alert for messengers of the Good News, even among those who do not measure up to our idea of a prophet. Jesus didn’t measure up either.

In choosing this theme, Pope Francis reaffirmed that World Mission Sunday is a privileged opportunity for us to foster missionary cooperation on both the spiritual and material levels.

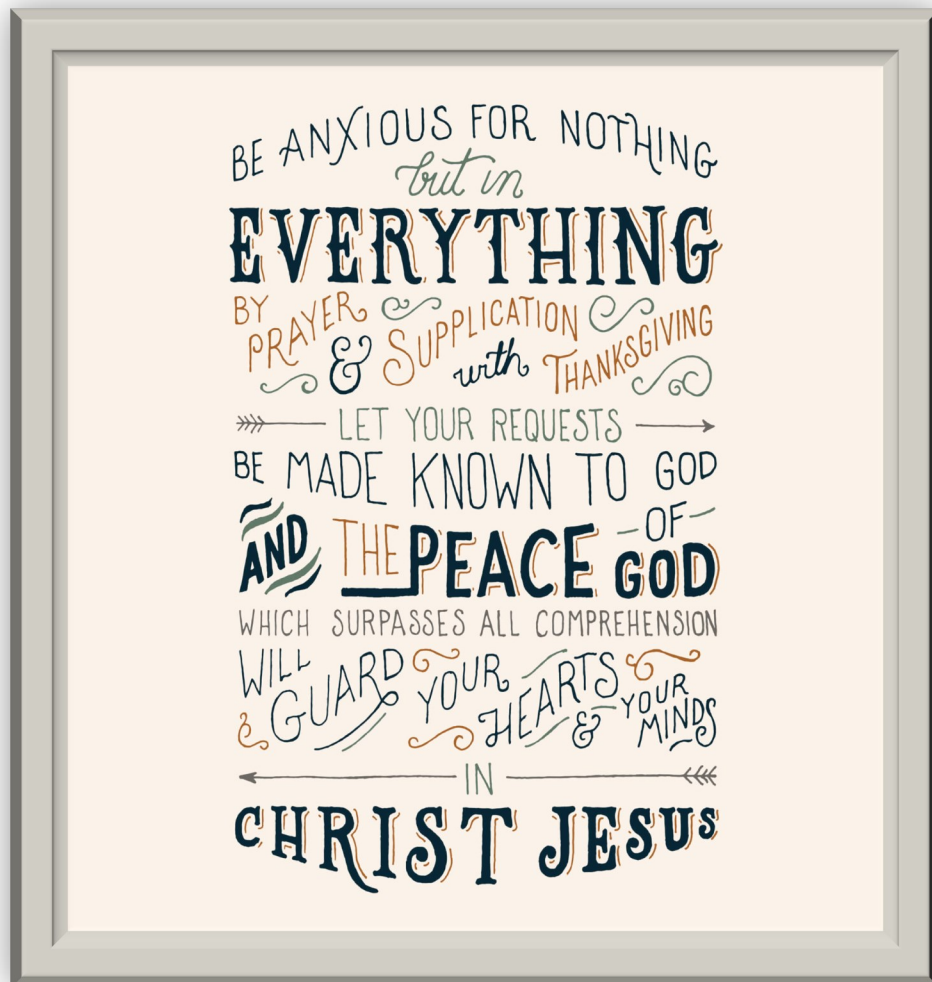

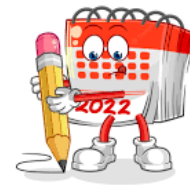
