Isaiah 25:6-10a: For our ancestors, there was no greater sign of unity, hospitality and shalom than a meal taken together with family and friends. The worst kind of betrayal was that of a friend who sat at one’s table. Isaiah looks forward to that day when Israel will be restored to her former greatness and enjoy the blessings of a happy life under the provident hand of God.

Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20: Paul expresses his sincere gratitude for the kindness of the Philippians in sending gifts to provide for his basic needs. He points out that his real strength and sustenance comes from the Lord - as must ours. Though he could do without the charity of the Philippians, he is grateful for their kindness. and takes obvious delight in assuring them that God will reward them for their generosity.

Matthew 22:1-14: The parable of the wedding feast tells us that those who were children of the covenant who refused to accept God’s reign in the person of Jesus, would have no part in the kingdom. Therefore, the Gentiles (foreigners, outsiders and sinners), who had no expectation or hope of an invitation, would replace them as the king’s guests.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY-OCTOBER 22ND: Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday (WMS) in 1926. Held each year on the penultimate (next-to-last) Sunday in October, WMS is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young, or actively persecuted. This year's message from Pope Francis for WMS is "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," and is inspired by our Lord's encounter with the disciples on the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-25). In choosing this theme, Pope Francis reaffirmed that World Mission Sunday is a privileged opportunity for us to foster missionary cooperation on both the spiritual and material levels. With our daily prayer and generous donation on the 22nd, we all bear witness to the compassion of Christ, making Him present in every continent, country, city, family, and heart. Thank you!

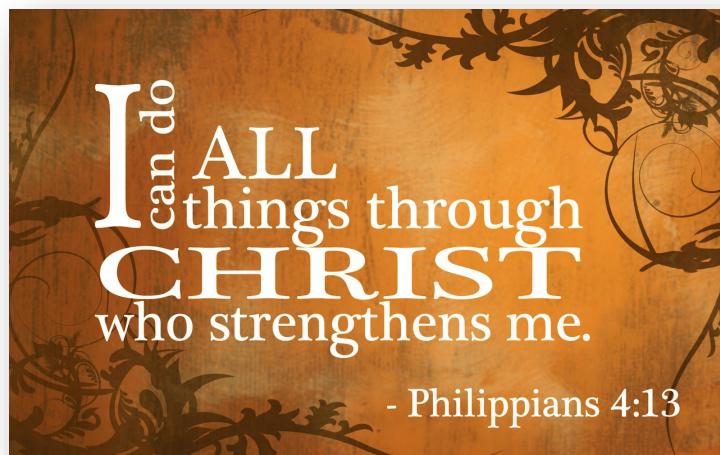
