Isaiah 45:1, 4-6: God makes use of the pagan king, Cyrus, to accomplish good things for the chosen people, Israel. God will achieve the work of salvation employing the power of nonbelievers if necessary. We do not live in isolation from the non-Christian world, nor should we try. If Christianity is not aggressively inclusive, it is unworthy of its name.

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b: Paul explains to the Thessalonians that the reason for their fidelity is the fact they received the Good News as a way of living rather than a mere code of conduct. Christianity can never be seen as a set of rules to obey. Christianity is the person of the risen Jesus living and active in the world through those who bear his name. Rules keep changing; Jesus doesn't.

Matthew 22:15-21: The response Jesus gives regarding the paying of taxes recognizes that the state has its place in society, but it cannot lay claim to what belongs to God. In other words, the power of the state is limited and does not supplant God's authority. Jesus implies that a ruler has no power except that which is given from above, a point he makes explicitly to Pilate during his trial. "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY - TODAY: Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday (WMS) in 1926. Held each year on the penultimate (next-to-last) Sunday in October, WMS is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young, or actively persecuted. This year's message from Pope Francis for WMS is "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," and is inspired by our Lord's encounter with the disciples on the

Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-25). In choosing this theme, Pope Francis reaffirmed that World Mission Sunday is a privileged opportunity for us to foster missionary cooperation on both the spiritual and material levels. With our daily prayer and generous donation on the 22nd, we all bear witness to the compassion of Christ, making Him present in every continent, country, city, family, and heart. POPE CALLS FOR WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PEACE: Jerusalem — Warning against a humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza and ongoing conflicts elsewhere, Pope Francis has called for a day of fasting, penance, and prayer for peace in the world October 27th.

“War does not solve any problems, it only sows death and destruction. It increases hatred, multiplies revenge. War erases the future,” he said at the end of his general audience talk in St. Peter’s Square Oct. 18. “Our thoughts go to Palestine and Israel. Casualties are rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate. Please, may everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian catastrophe. Silence the weapons. Listen to the cry of the poor, the people, the children, for peace.”

He urged all people of faith to take “just one side in this conflict: that of peace. But not with words, with prayer, with total dedication.”

For this reason, the Pope has decided to call for a day of fasting, prayer and penance October 27th. The Pope invited men and women of every Christian denomination and other religions as well as those committed to the cause of peace to participate in any way they feel is appropriate.

There will be an hour of prayer starting at 6 p.m. Rome time in St. Peter’s “imploring for peace in the world,” he said, and local churches are invited to organize similar initiatives.

A LITTLE TIBERIUS, TRIBUTE PENNY TRIVIA: One ancient coin leads all the others in demand by Christians who otherwise do not collect coins. Several Bible passages mention coins but none are more certainly identified than the Tribute Penny of Matthew 22:19 and Mark 12:15. Both accounts name the coin shown to Jesus as a denarius (usually translated into English as 'penny'). How is it that this one type of denarius is so widely recognized as the one that played a part in this story?

The reverses of Roman coins were regularly used as media of propaganda. Coin types were changed frequently and tended to reflect the current news of the day. Emperors who were in power for only a short time usually issued several varieties. Pertinax, who reigned for three months in 193 AD, struck ten major types of denarii (not counting minor varieties). In his 41-year reign, Caesar Augustus released over a hundred types. Tiberius was Emperor for 23 years and is represented by two denarii. After 15 AD all Tiberius denarii were the same type: PONTIF MAXIM surrounding a seated female figure. Huge numbers of these coins were produced; many thousands of them still exist today. There has never been a more fortunate numismatic circumstance. This coin in the highest demand is among the most common of all Roman silver coins.

That coin collectors have settled on this one coin as THE Tribute Penny is more of a convention than a historical fact. It is, however, quite likely that this type was among the most common denarii in circulation in the early 30's AD and it does show the Emperor who reigned at the time of the ministry of Jesus Christ.

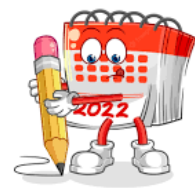
