Exodus 22:20-26: The indignation of God can seem brutal. It is not easy to hear the words “I will kill you with the sword,” but the very force of this threat impresses us with just how outrageous it is to mistreat the helpless. It also reminds us that widespread or politically sanctioned oppression always leads to war and bloodshed.

1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10: Paul encourages the Thessalonians to “walk through the world and be its light.” He congratulates them for being a model of the faith for Macedonia and Achaia and beyond. Though young in faith, the strength of their belief is already praised and emulated in distant lands.

Matthew 22:34-40: Fulfilling the law by loving God and neighbor is not an original idea to Jesus. It exists early in Hebrew scriptures and continues to appear throughout them. There is something unique, however, in Jesus’ claim. He is saying that we can’t have one without the other. Love of neighbor springs naturally from genuine love of God; love of God is demonstrated and strengthened in love of neighbor. It’s “faith versus good works,” and Jesus solves it for all time. Faith without good works is dead.

QAC EXTENDS A WARM WELCOME TODAY TO FR. JAMES L. HEFT, S.M.,

(MARIANIST): Fr. James Heft, SM has been a priest and leader in higher Catholic education for over 30 years, including many of which were at University of Dayton serving in positions of Theology Department chair, Provost and Chancellor. He left the University of Dayton in 2006 to found the Institute for Advanced Catholic Studies at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles, where he served

as the Alton Brooks Professor of Religion and the Founder and President Emeritus of the Institute until returning to the University of Dayton this summer. During his time as president, the Institute published twenty books. Fr. Heft has written and edited fourteen books and published over 200 articles and book chapters. Fr. Heft is not teaching this year but is devoting his time to writing. Next fall he hopes to teach a course with the tentative title, "What Kind of Life is Worth Living." Thanks Fr. ### **NEW SEASON UPDATE**

#### **October Community Meeting**

During the meeting there were updates from the community coordinators, a presentation of the Social Justice Task Force's work and recommendations, an educational presentation on branding and why it matters to our community by the Branding Task Force. and an update and recommendation on the gathering frequency/day/time by the New Gatherings Task Force. During Sunday's meeting, the recommendation was made for our community to gather on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 3 p.m., beginning in January. (Full details are available at the link above.)

## Questions & Answers

***Are the recommendations for gathering time and social justice activities presented last weekend final? Has the decision formally been made?***

No. Like each step of this New Season process, community feedback has been gathered, the task forces have prayerfully created recommendations, and now we're soliciting additional input. In early November the Leadership Team and the New Seasons Committee will meet to make a decision about scheduling the Madeleine Room for the first part of 2024 for our community. As with all decision meetings, this meeting will be open and announced in advance. And, we'll collectively evaluate our meeting time next year to learn if it's working and make changes if needed. Like so much of our New Season work, we'll start and learn as we go!

***If we are passionately pursuing social justice in our new community, will we lose the focus on our community? Will we just be focused on serving others?***

No. In the new mission statement of the community, we state: "We are a community of disciples deeply rooted in love. We continuously work to be the holy people God calls us to be in our church and our world, embracing a "Martha and Mary" rhythm of spiritual growth and service."

The time that we gather together will be our spiritual nourishment to then be sent out into the world to serve. Gathering, learning, and loving as a community will still very much be part of our collective identity.

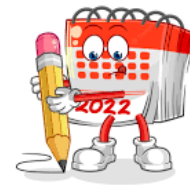
